<u>Week 1:</u> God's plan for Saul – how Saul's life and vision changed. Exploring how faith can change our lives.

<u>Week 2:</u> Apostle Paul's early years – how Paul began his ministry and the challenges he faced. Exploring how we respond to God's calls.

<u>Week 3:</u> Paul in the middle of religious conflict – how Paul and other apostles found a way to resolve the conflict in a way that reflected Jesus Christ. Exploring how we respond to different understandings of Jesus.

<u>Week 4:</u> Paul's time in Ephesus and later missionary journeys. Exploring how churches can support the communities around them.

<u>Week 5:</u> Paul's journey and time in Rome. Exploring how we can know peace even in difficult times.
